



Natalia Vacarciuc, originally from Moldova (one of the republics of the former Soviet Union), received her undergraduate degree in her home town Chisinau, the capital of Moldova, at the Academy of Music "G. Musicescu." Immediately upon completion of these studies, Ms. Vacarciuc became principal cellist at both the National Symphony Orchestra "TV-Radio Moldova" and the chamber orchestra of the National Theatre "M. Eminescu." In 2001 she came to the United States to continue her education, pursuing the Master of Music degree at Southeastern Louisiana University in Hammond. Since then Ms. Vacarciuc has performed in numerous chamber music ensembles, orchestras, and summer festivals throughout the US, including the Baton Rouge Symphony, Gulf Coast Symphony, and Lubbock Symphony. In 2002 she was a semi-finalist in the Fischhoff National Chamber

Music Competition. Dr. Vacarciuc recently received her doctoral degree in cello performance from Texas Tech University where she also taught cello for several years as a teaching assistant. She now lives and teaches in Bismarck where she is principal cellist with the Bismarck-Mandan Symphony Orchestra and serves on the faculty of the International Music Camp.
